Gross went 4-0 at second singles and first doubles, as the Mighty Macs swept all four of their CSAC matches this week. She won in straight sets over Clarks Summit, Cedar Crest, Notre Dame, and Cabrini, and partnered with Lauren Degnan to take all four of their doubles matches at the first position.

CSAC HONOR ROLL

REBECCA GRABER Jr. - Cairn University

Graber was a perfect 6-0 on the week between singles and doubles play. With her singles victory against Kean, Graber won her 33rd singles match to break a tie with Katelynn Wilson for the most victories in Cairn women's tennis history. With the help of Bianca Birney, Graber went 3-0 in doubles play and broke the program record for victories in doubles with her 22nd.

AVERY MCCALL Sr. - Marywood University

McCall led Marywood to a 2-0 week and helped the Pacers clinch a berth in the CSAC post season by going 2-0 at #2 doubles and 2-0 at #3 singles. In singles action she allowed just three points, winning 6-0, 6-1 over Misericordia and 6-2, 6-0 over Cairn. In doubles she allowed just one with an 8-0 win alongside partner Danielle Ogonowski over Misericordia and a 8-1 win over Cairn.

AROUND THE CSAC

CABRINI CAVALIERS (6-6, 5-3 CSAC)

The Cavaliers fell to 6-6 overall and 5-3 in the CSAC after going 1-1 last week. The Blue and White scored an 8-1 Senior Day win over Clarks Summit, while suffering shutout losses to Gwynedd Mercy and Immaculata. Cabrini faces a big week, as it hosts Alvernia Wednesday before visiting Rosemont and Notre Dame of Maryland this weekend in a battle for the final spot in the CSAC Tournament.

CAIRN HIGHLANDERS (4-8, 2-6 CSAC)

The Cairn women's tennis team went 0-3 this past week, with losses to Cedar Crest, Kean, and Marywood. The week was not without bright spots for the Highlanders. Highlighting the week was **Rebecca Graber** going a combined 6-0 between singles and doubles play. In the process of her perfect week, **Graber** became the all-time singles wins leader in Cairn women's tennis history after she picked up a 6-4, 6-4 victory in her singles match against Kean. Graber finished her week with 34 singles victories, two more than the previous high set by **Katelynn Wilson**. With the help of **Bianca Birney**, **Graber** also knocked out the Cairn doubles victory record with her 22nd over the weekend.

CEDAR CREST FALCONS (7-6, 5-4 CSAC)

The Falcons had four matches this week. The first was a reschedule from the week before against Cairn where the team won 6-3. They fell 9-0 to Immaculata, but bounced back with a 9-0 win over Keystone. In a tough battle with Notre Dame the match came down to the final point that fell in favor of the Gators as the Falcons fell 5-4. The next match for the Falcons is on Friday, October 14 at Gwynedd Mercy.

CLARKS SUMMIT DEFENDERS (1-8, 1-6 CSAC)

It was a winless week for the Lady Defenders as they dropped three conference matches. The team was blanked by Immaculata University 9-0 and lost 8-1 to both Cabrini University and Neumann University. **Chelsea Miller** earned both points for CSU, winning at the No. 2 singles flight in both matches. In their final week of the season, the Lady Defenders will take on Marywood University and Gwynedd Mercy University on Friday and Saturday on the road.

GWYNEDD MERCY GRIFFINS (10-0, 8-0 CSAC)

The women's tennis team picked up three 9-0 victories this week against Cabrini, Arcadia and Keystone. The pair of CSAC victories also helped them clinch a berth in the CSAC team championships with a 8-0 conference mark.

IMMACULATA MIGHTY MACS (10-4, 6-2 CSAC)

The Mighty Macs had a huge week as they won all four CSAC matches this week while not dropping a point. IU has now won five matches in a row. The defeated Clarks Summit, Cedar Crest, and Notre Dame 9-0, and followed that with a rain-shortened 5-0 victory over Cabrini. A win will likely clinch a fourth straight playoff berth for the Macs. They will host York in their final home match of the season before travelling to Neumann and Rosemont this weekend.

AROUND THE CSAC

KEYSTONE GIANTS (1-9, 1-7 CSAC)

Keystone went 0-4 last week, falling to King's (9-0), Cedar Crest (9-0), Rosemont (7-2), and Gwynedd Mercy (9-0).

Devinne Scott won a pair of matches against the Ravens, picking up victories at #1 singles and #1 doubles while **Rosa Morales** teamed up with **Scott** for the win at #1 doubles at Rosemont. Keystone will wrap up the season with a pair of conference matches this week, visiting Neumann on Wednesday before hosting Cairn on Saturday.

MARYWOOD PACERS (9-2, 7-1 CSAC)

Marywood went 2-0 on the week and clinched a CSAC playoff berth. The Pacers beat Misericordia 6-3 midweek and Cairn 7-2 on the weekend. Marywood hosts Clarks Summit Friday before traveling to Neumann Saturday to wrap up regular season CSAC action. The Pacers stand at 10-2 (7-1 CSAC) on the year and assured themselves of a berth in one of two semifinals.

NEUMANN KNIGHTS (3-6, 3-4 CSAC)

Neumann picked up back to back wins on the road at Rosemont and Clarks Summit to make it three consecutive CSAC wins. **Sophie Brink** led the Knights, winning at both first singles and first doubles in both matches. **Angie Salvucci** and **Frances Bockary** were also critical in Neumann's success and won matches at second doubles in both contests. The Knights return home for their final four regular season games this week. They will host Eastern University on Tuesday afternoon before hosting three CSAC matches versus Keystone, Immaculata and Marywood to end the week.

NOTRE DAME GATORS (6-3, 5-3 CSAC)

The Gators went 2-1 last week, falling to Immaculata (9-0) but earning wins over Trinity (7-2) and Cedar Crest (5-4). Senior **Natalie Smith** went 2-1 in No. 3 singles and 1-2 in No. 1 doubles. Junior **Catherine Bruzdinski** also earned a pair of wins in her singles and doubles matches. NDMU hosts Cairn on Friday before welcoming Cabrini to campus Saturday for a senior day matchup.

ROSEMONT RAVENS (1-10, 1-7 CSAC)

The Ravens started their five match home stand Tuesday taking a loss against PSU-Berks. Then they found themselves on the short-end of the match on Friday against Neumann. Their luck turned for the better on Saturday after the start of the match was moved up due to the threat of rain Rosemont responded well earning their first win of the season beating a depleted Keystone. It was also the first career win for Ravens head coach **Kirsten Sanford**. After a busy week last week Rosemont can rest until Friday when they will host Cabrini at 3:30pm. The season wraps up on Saturday afternoon at noon when Immaculata comes to town for Senior Day.
